Probate

Probate is the process in which property passes when an individual dies with only a Will, or no Will or other estate planning documents in-place. The probate process can be difficult to navigate and stressful to complete properly without experience. Asset Protection

Assets that are shielded from creditors by law are few (common examples include some home equity, certain retirement plans and interests in LLCs and limited partnerships [and even these are not always unreachable]). Assets that are almost always unreachable are those to which one does not hold legal title. In many cases it is possible to vest legal title to personal assets in a trust, an agent or a nominee, while retaining all the control of the assets. The goal of asset protection is similar to bankruptcy, and the two practice areas go hand-in-hand.

When someone has none or few assets, he/she relies on bankruptcy if he/she needs protection from creditors. On the other hand, if someone has significant assets, asset protection is a more preferred solution. Legal Separation
